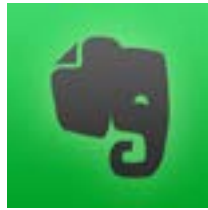
HSHM Policies & Regulations

Policy on Cell Phones and Electronic Communication Devices:

The ban on bringing cell phones and other electronic communication devices was lifted on March of 2015. As per the school chancellor, students are allowed to bring their devices to school. Items include and are not limited to: laptops, iPads, cell phones, etc. However, this does not mean that students can use their devices during school hours. College Planning Starts Now!

No matter what grade, college becomes an important aspect of your child's academic career. It is important and highly suggested for students as well as parents/guardians to begin thinking about college as early as the ninth grade. Below is a guide of what you should be looking out for as school progresses:

Ninth Grade:

- The initial weeks of high school can be an overwhelming adjustment both socially and academically. Parents/Guardians, it is important to keep open dialogue about how classes are going. If you see your child struggling, now is the time to access your resources. You may also want to speak about placing your child in more advanced classes in the future if the work seems too easy.
- As classes progress, encourage school involvement in extracurricular activities (athletics and clubs) and volunteering (service learning opportunities) in and out of school. Allow your child to feel out what they are comfortable with and how much time they can dedicate without impacting their schoolwork negatively.
- Begin compiling a record that lists your child's participation in activities, as well as accomplishments, awards and any leadership positions they have acquired.

Tenth Grade:

- Encourage preliminary testing! Start prepping your child for the PSAT's. The PSAT is a standardized exam that helps prepare students to take the SAT or ACT. A great score on the PSAT can also open the door to National Merit scholarship awards.
- Continue to encourage your child's involvement on campus. Motivate your child to continue or foster relationships with clubs in the school, as well as seek leadership roles within clubs.
- Make sure your child sets up a my College Board account.

Eleventh Grade:

- Make sure your child is prepared to take the SAT's. This is an entrance exam used by most colleges and universities to make admissions decisions. Your child's SAT score is a pivotal component of their college applications!
- Be aware of your child's academic performance.
- Go to college fairs. Accompany your child in visiting colleges, and gathering information about the colleges attended. Encourage your child to gain familiarity with the college resources available at the school.

Twelfth Grade:

- This year is about solidifying! Go over your child's options for college and start application processes.
- Continue attending college fairs.
- Move your child in the "write" direction! Have your child begin looking at application essay topics and have them start brainstorming and compiling their ideas.
- If college applications require recommendations, now is the time to have your child ask the teachers and staff.
- Gather required documents and have your child take their SAT's. If they have already done so, have them submit grades through the College Board. Make sure your child attends Financial Aid Night and begin filling out the FAFSA application.



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
